More Russian woes for Trump

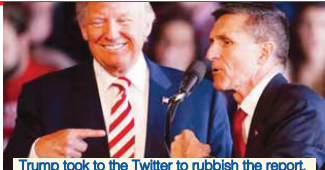
NYT says his aides were in cahoots with Russian Intelligence
Trump calls it non-sense on behalf of Hillary's failed campaign

The Russian ghost simply refuses to let go of the fledgling Donald Trump administration. A day after National Security adviser Michael Flynn quit over his pre-inauguration phone conversations with the Russian Ambassador, *The New York Times* on Wednesday reported that Trump's campaign aides had repeated contacts with senior Russian intelligence officials during the year prior to the November 2016 election.

Trump took to the Twitter to rubbish the report, dubbing the claim of Russian connection "non-sense" and terming the NYT report a "cover-up" for the "many mistakes made in Hillary Clinton's losing campaign." "The fake news media is going crazy with their conspiracy theories and blind hatred," @MSNBC, @CNN and @foxnews tweeted on Wednesday morning.

Citing current and former US officials, *The Times* spoke of phone records and intercepted calls pointing to the falling out with contacts that the Trump campaign aides and other associates had with Russian intelligence

officials. It, however, said there was no evidence as yet that the Trump campaign colluded with the Russians on the hacking of the Democratic National Committee in a bid to influence the US presidential race.

Trump slammed the intelligence agencies as well for allegedly leaking classified information. "The real scandal here are unwelcome," he tweeted on Wednesday morning.

"Information is being illegally given out by 'intelligence' like candy. Very un-American!" he tweeted, adding: "Information is being illegally given to the falling @nytimes & @washingpost by the intelligence community (NSA and FBI). Just like Russia."

While his alleged nexus with Russian leader Vladimir Putin has been the constant refrain in the liberal US media for the past many months, Trump sought to point out that Russia annexed Crimea during the Obama administration, quizzing: "Was Obama too soft on Russia?"

The new disclosures by the NYT came just as the White House was struggling to contain the fallout from the resignation of NSA Flynn over his phone conversation with Russian Ambassador Sergey Kislyak prior in the weeks prior to Trump's inauguration on January 20.

Changing tack on Flynn's

departure, the White House said on Tuesday that Trump sought and got the NSA resignation because of "eroding trust", insisting that he did not break the law in his conversations with the Russian envoy.

"There is not a legal issue but rather a trust issue," White House Press Secretary Sean Spicer said, adding the circumstances had created a "critical mass and an unsustainable situation." "The President must have complete and unwavering trust for the person in that position," he said.

Democratic lawmakers are demanding an independent probe that should go well beyond Flynn's departure into the relations of the Trump White House with Putin's Russia. "This is larger than Flynn," House Democratic Caucus chairman Joseph Crowley said, adding, "The real question with respect to Flynn is: What did President Trump know, and when did he know it? Did the president order Flynn to call the Russians?"

Republican leaders, however, made it clear that they have no plans to go that path, with Speaker Paul Ryan shifting their focus on repealing Obamacare, not to dig deeper into the Flynn resignation issue.

27 US lawmakers to visit India this month

As many as 27 US lawmakers will be visiting India this month when Indian Ambassador Navtej Sarna regards as "a very important milestone" that is demonstrative of the high degree of American interest in India and the strong bipartisan support for the India-US relationship.

Sarna, who hosted a Congressional reception on Tuesday, to celebrate India's engagement with the 115th US Congress, expressed the hope that the growing engagement would lead to a "more robust economic and commercial cooperation as India retains its spot as the fastest growing major economy."

The US lawmakers will be travelling in members of two different delegations. One, sponsored by the Aspen Institute, will bring 19 lawmakers of both Republican and Democratic parties from February 20 to 25, with stops in New Delhi and Hyderabad.



House Democratic Whip Steny Hoyer made a strong pitch for enhanced cooperation on security issues between the two big democracies, while Republican Congressman Dana Rohrabacher wanted a broader push to address the growing threat from extremist radical terrorism. Indian American lawmaker Ami Bera, who is also the Democratic co-chair of the India Caucus, expressed confidence that the US-India relationship would be a defining one for the 21st century.

The second one will be a bipartisan Congressional delegation, led by Republican lawmaker Bob Goodlatte, who heads the House Judiciary Committee. This team, which also includes George Holding, the Republican co-chair of the India Caucus, will be visiting New Delhi and Bangalore from February 20 to 23.

Jordan commander: ISIS expands hold in border camp for Syrians

Jordan-Syria Border: The commander of Jordan's border guards says Islamic State extremists are expanding their influence in a border camp for displaced Syrians, posing a growing threat to the US-ally kingdom.

Brig Gen Sami Kafawin spoke to the Associated Press during a tour of the desert area where Jordan, Syria and Iraq meet. A ride in a military helicopter offered a view of the Jordan camp, an expanse of makeshift shelters housing tens of thousands of Syrians.

Conditions in the camp deteriorated sharply after Jordan sealed its border in June, following a cross-border IS attack that killed seven Jordanian border guards. AP

China awards Trump valuable new trademark

Shanghai: China has awarded President Donald Trump a valuable new trademark.

The win comes after a 10-year dispute and raises a host of ethical questions about the president's foreign intellectual property. China's Trademark Office posted the registration of Trump's new mark, which became official February 14, to its website on Wednesday. It gives Trump the right to use his name for building construction services in China through 2027.

INDIA, NEPAL AGREE TO REDUCE NEW CROSS-BORDER POWER LINES

Kathmandu: In view of the various power projects being developed in Nepal, India and the Himalayan nation have agreed to lay down new cross-border transmission lines. In this regard, laying of new Butwal (Nepal)-Gorakhpur (India) and Lumbini (Nepal)-Bareilly (India) Transmission lines and setting up of new 400KV sub-stations at Dhanbari, Butwal and Hetauda — all in Nepal — were discussed during the fourth meeting of the Indo-Nepal Joint Working Group and Joint India-Nepal Steering Committee (JSC) on Power Cooperation that concluded here on Tuesday.

HATE CRIME IN UK REACHES RECORD LEVELS

London: A majority of police forces in England and Wales saw record levels of hate crimes in the first full year since the referendum, according to new analysis.

JUDGE IN JAIL: TURKEY URGED TO REPORT TO UN THE HAGUE: A defence lawyer urged a UN war crimes court to report Turkey to the UN Security Council for failing to free a judge jailed in Ankara's post-coup crackdown.

8 KILLED IN 'TERROR ATTACK' IN CHINA

Beijing: Three knife-wielding suspected Uyghur militants killed five persons before being shot dead by police in China's western Xinjiang province, the latest "terror attack" in the restive Muslim-majority region.

CHINA TO LAUNCH ITS 2ND AIRCRAFT CARRIER

Beijing: China's second aircraft carrier, designed to be a base for fighter jets and helicopters, will be launched later this year and is expected to enter service in 2020, an official said.

LIBYA RIVALS AGREE TO EXPLORE WAYS TO END RIFT

Cairo: Rival powers in Libya have agreed to form a committee to explore amending a UN-backed deal and the country's political turmoil, Egypt announced on Wednesday after hosting talks. The host, Libya's unity government Fayez al-Sarraj and rival army chief Marshal Khalifa Haftar had been in Cairo this week for talks mediated by the Egyptian army.

EU VOTES ON CONTESTED CANADA TRADE DEAL

Sarasajit: The European Parliament was expected to approve a contested EU-Canada free trade deal today despite rising anti-globalisation anger in Europe and the protectionist sentiment in the US Trump administration.

will join our Republic Day celebrations. India & UAE share strong bonds of friendship & extensive cooperation. Looking forward to building on this & further cementing ties," Modi tweeted.

This is the second visit of the Crown Prince to India in the last one year. From the Indian side, Modi had visited Dubai in August 2015, which was the first visit by an Indian PM in 33 years, last being former PM Indira Gandhi in 1981.

Republic Day: 777 cops get police medals, 100 bestowed with gallantry

A total of 777 police and paramilitary personnel have been awarded police medals while 100 have been decorated for gallantry, led by Jammu & Kashmir police, on the occasion of Republic Day.

The gallantry tally is led by Jammu and Kashmir Police with 32 Police Medals for Gallantry (PMG) followed by the country's largest paramilitary CRPF with 16 medals.

Out of the 100 bravery medals, ten have been decorated posthumously, with Manipur Police Inspector P Sanjiv Singh getting it for a record eighth time.

Interestingly, there have been no Prestans Police Medals for Gallantry (PPMG) awarded this year.

While the Jammu and Kashmir police got a majority of these decorations for counter-insurgency operations in the state, the Central Reserve Police Force got them for undertaking dare-devil exploits in anti-Naxal operations in Left Wing Extremism affected States.

As per an official statement, personnel of Manipur and Assam police have been decorated with four gallantry medals each, Jharkhand nine and Uttar Pradesh got seven.

"777 personnel have been awarded police medals on the occasion of the Republic Day this year. Police Medals for Gallantry (PMG) have been awarded to 100 personnel, Prestans' Police Medals for Distinguished Service to 80 personnel and Police Medal for Meritorious Service to 597 personnel," the statement said.

cash for carrying out RBI operations," said a Government spokesman. A sum of ₹15,000 crore allocated during 2016-17 to implement the Interest Subvention Scheme (ISS) has already been utilised, said the statement.

Officials say that the farmers who have paid interest on short-term loans during the demonetisation period of November and December 2016 will get the refund in their bank accounts within a month.

Benefit Transfer. The Government provides short-term crop loans up to ₹3 lakh at subvented interest rate of 7 per cent per annum.

'Ram temple will be built if BJP gets full majority'

New Delhi: BJP on Tuesday raked up again the contentious issue of Ram Temple before the first phase of Uttar Pradesh Assembly elections on February 13.

He also cut out at Akshillesh Yadav, saying the UP chief minister is neither with Backward Classes nor Dalits. "The only betrays". His remark came after Justice Chandrachud of the Supreme Court directed the UP Pradesh government to ensure that no fresh caste certificates are issued to those belonging to 17 Other Backward Classes (OBC) groups.

Kyoto Protocol: Cabinet gives nod to reify second commitment period

The Cabinet on Tuesday gave its approval to ratify the second commitment period of the 1997 Kyoto Protocol extending from 2013 to 2020 — for checking the emission of Green House Gases. The second phase was adopted in 2012, with 65 countries having ratified the Second Commitment Period so far.

"In view of the critical role played by India in securing international consensus on climate change issues, this decision further underlines the country's leadership in the company of nations committed to global cause of environmental protection and climate justice," said an Environment Ministry statement after the Cabinet meeting.

The Kyoto protocol recognizes that developed countries are principally responsible for the current top levels of Greenhouse Gas (GHGs) and that the protocol places commitments on developed nations to undertake emission targets and to provide financial resources and transfer of technology to the developing nations.

India's ratification is expected to encourage other developing countries also to follow suit.

Centre decides to withdraw Jan 8, 2016 notification over Jallikattu

The Centre has decided to withdraw its January 8, 2016 notification allowing Jallikattu with certain restrictions. The decision comes at a time when the Supreme Court is expected to deliver its judgment on the validity of the said notification since it runs contrary to the May 2014 judgment of the apex court banning Jallikattu.
